# HANDLEY NEIGHBORHOOD ASSOCIATION MINUTES March, 2010

The Handley Neighborhood Association met on Monday, March 8, 2010 at the Handley United Methodist Church. President Joann Ehlers called the meeting to order at 7:00pm. Nedia Dryden gave the opening prayer. The minutes were read, corrected and approved. The Treasurer's report was also read and approved. The following announcements were made by President Joann Ehlers:

- There will be a garage sale on June 5, 2010 from 9AM to 5PM at the gazebo. Workable and useable items only. No junk. Will need volunteers to help.
- Census forms will be mailed soon. There will be ten questions. If forms are not returned, will get a visit.
- Debris from storm will not be charged for one time pick up.
- Cowtown Cleanup will be April 10. Meet at the 9AM at old Handley Feed Store. Trash will be picked up all over area.

## Reports:

Doris Harrison reported on the Historic Handley Railroad Museum at 1020 S. Handley Dr. It will be a meeting place and will be rented out for parties.

Dennis Mitchell, Code Compliance reported that there is a great need for volunteers. The city is cutting programs making it harder to cover all areas. There are 72 officers to cover the whole city. Carl Ellis of Code compliance also spoke. He is assisting with animal control and is giving citations and information out.

Betty Coomer of Code Blue reported that they are saturating areas to cut down crime.

Code Blue members remember to go to the academy to have your photo taken by Officer Perez for code Blue Seminar, May 22.

The HNA speaker for the evening was Diane Reid who is a Land Administrator of Approach Resources Inc. Diane gave a very informative talk. Chesapeake is the largest drilling company in the United States. There are three areas of gas drilling in the Handley area. Big Daddy is on the Eastside of Handley with Sandy Lane in the middle. It has three wells on it. Will drill on vacant lot by Enterprise Car Rental and at 7213 Lancaster, west of Rose Hill Cemetery formerly was a mobile home lot. Diane urged everyone to check the website of [www.ryanwoodna.org](http://www.ryanwoodna.org) on what is going on. Landscaping will be worked on at the locations with the barriers pulled down. Drilling takes 3 1/2 weeks and completion rig is there for only 3-4 days. She stated there had not been any complaints on gas vapors and there is no danger as there are many safe guards.

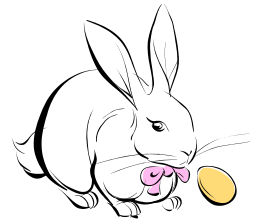

We have lost so many trees and bushes with all the heavy wet snow We are about to get water logged. Now is a good time to get out and pull those ever growing weeds, while the ground is still moist. I attended our Eastside Ministries Board Meeting on March 11th. Eastside Ministries does so much good in our community towards helping so many people, who are out of work and who are less fortunate than us and are in great need of food and clothing. Eastside Ministries needs our support. In the last 2 to 3 years we have spent more money helping people who are down on their luck ,than we have money coming into ESM. It's really getting serious. We may have to go to 4 days a week opening instead of the usual 5 days a week, some staff hours have been cut to help meet the budget. If we don't make our budget this year, we may soon be out of funds. Times are hard for everyone right now, even churches, who contribute toward our support. We need the communities support. Lancaster, Ft. Worth, TX. 76112 We need your help desperately, if we are going to be able to keep our doors open.. We served 20% more clients this year than we did last year. In July, Rev. Max Brennan, from St. Matthew United Methodist Church on Hitson Lane, will sponsor a Gospel night, with the proceeds going to ESM.

St. Rita's Church just sponsored a dinner dance as a fund raiser for ESM. Our April meeting will be held at Eastern Hills United Methodist Church and our May meeting will be held at King of Glory Lutheran Church.

One of our Handley Businesses—"The Handley Station Café" is still collecting canned vegetables --4 cans--and for the 4 cans, un-dented and not out of date cans, you get a free dessert and ESM receives the much needed food for their shelves.

On Friday, March 12<sup>th</sup>, Pat Brown and Norm Bermes along with the police department held a meeting at the Community Center in regards to a Neighborhood Watch Program. We need to have more people become involved in our crime watches. You don't have to get out and drive around as you do in Code Blue. All you have to do is keep watch in your own neighborhoods for anything suspicious looking taking place and call it in, either to the police department or to your neighborhood watch block captain. If they can't get enough people interested and involved , the Neighborhood Watch Program will discontinue. You just need to keep a watch out your windows and in your comings and goings to the store or etc. Another meeting will be called for those of us who expressed a desire to keep the Neighborhood Watch Program going. Take care until next time and remember our ill and bereaved members in your thoughts and prayers—call them, send them a card and better yet go see them.

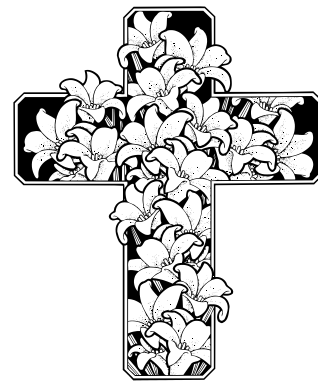

# THE HANDLEY NEWS

BY DAVID DUNNETT

Continued from the March 2010 Newsletter:

Also, in 1922, a new high school was built at 2915 Haynie St. At the time that planning for the new high school was going on, a part of the trustees, headed by Dr. Riley Foster, wished to build it south of the tracks near the Interurban power house and the others of whom Mr. A.G. Rosser was a leader, wished to build it on the hill north of the tracks, so that anyone coming into town would first see the school and know that the community was most interested in the education of its children. The hill became its home.

In the summer of 1928, the Handley Schools became a part of the Fort Worth Independent School District. At that time, Mr. C.S. Carter was superintendent of Handley Schools, and there were 442 elementary students and 195 high school students. The Handley Schools were accredited when they became a part of the Fort Worth System.

In 1954, the Handley Elementary school was so over crowded that a new elementary school was built and the district was divided. At that time, the old Handley Elementary School became East Handley Elementary School and the new one at 2749 Putnam was called West Handley Elementary School. Classes continued to be held in old East Handley Elementary School until February 24, 1959. At one time, a crack formed in the wall of the northeast classrooms and an iron bar had to be placed through the wall to reinforce it. Some roof work also had to be done, but it was a beautifully kept school and the landscaping of the grounds was very attractive. On February 24, 1959, the teachers and pupils moved from old East Handley School to a new building located on 4.268 acres of land at 2617 Mims. The old building was used by the Y.M.C.A. for awhile. In 1961 the building was sold, torn down and a new luxury motel was erected on the property.

The new East Handley Elementary was outgrown almost before it was finished and the grounds were soon covered with temporary buildings. The district was again divided and in September of 1967, half of the teachers and all of the students north of Meadowbrook reported to the new school, Atwood McDonald Elementary School located at 1850 Barron Lane.

1959 also saw the opening of a new high school at 5701 Shelton. This is called Eastern Hills High School, and the old high school building became a junior high. The junior high has since become a middle school, and a number of temporary buildings have been placed on campus in order to take care of the students who attend. Land has been obtained for a new high school in the vicinity of Cooks Lane and Meadowbrook Drive.

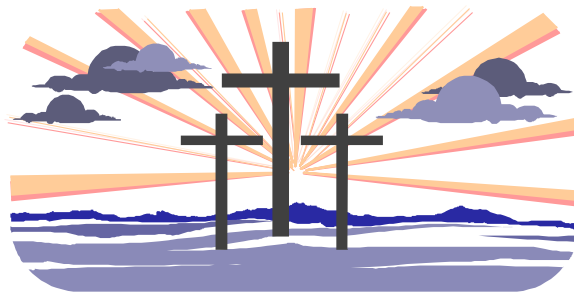

One of the interesting stories to come to light is that of Ederville. Shortly after 1900, this small community had some 2 or 3 stores, a hotel, a restaurant and Mineral Wells. Water from these wells were believed to have great curative powers. Popularity grew and a lot, 25' x 50', just large enough for a camp or wagon was selling for \$3,500.00. The water was cold and the "thing" was that you dug a hole, poured in the water to make a mud and lowered the afflicted limb into it. Later a sanatorium was built near by for drug addicts. The doctor's wife was the school teacher at the Ederville School, grades thru the 7<sup>th</sup> or 8<sup>th</sup>, located at the site of the Meadowbrook National Bank. Joseph Spaulding Works "known as Buckskin Joe" was prominent in this development. Mrs. Works served on the school board. It is believed that the Works are buried in the Isham Cemetery. Now as to what happened to the wells, controversy arose over whether they were public or private property, so they were blocked or filled in.
